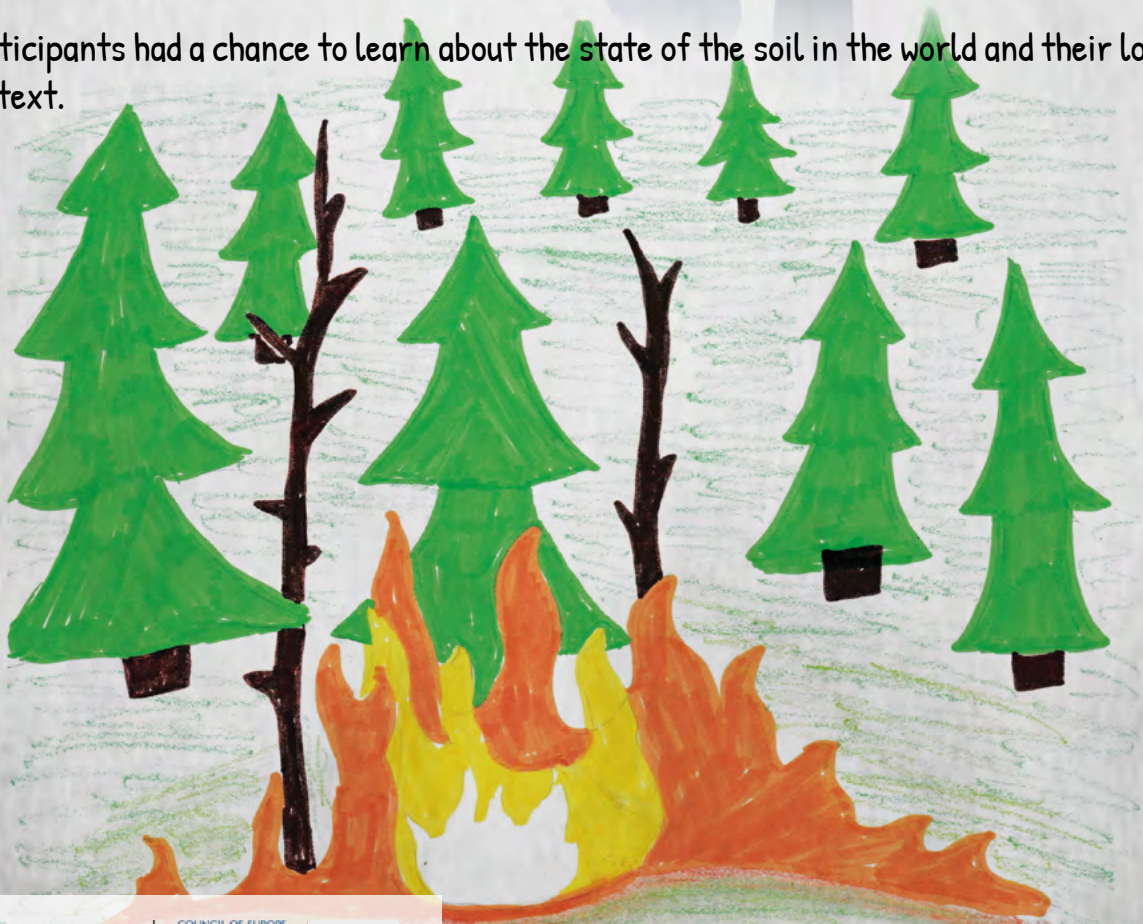




# Climate Change messages workshop

## Young people raise their voices to save the Planet!

The One World Association in Poland puts efforts into raising awareness about climate change and provides workshops and activities to involve communities in the topic and action. As part of our activities, we came up with the idea to organize school workshops in English about climate change and the state of soil. The high school students of a local school in Pniewy, Wielkopolska region took part in non-formal education workshops about the environment and eco-volunteering. They had a chance to reflect on climate change and share their concerns with their peers. The second stage of the activity involved a creative workshop where students prepared posters and drawings with messages and call for action to protect the planet. Their artworks focused on saving oceans, forests, and the planet. There was an official school exhibition with an opening and a tasty cake with a group photo.

Young people have their part in saving the earth. They take initiative and are willing to take actions. One of the drawings shows the earth held in a heart-shaped hand with a message: There is no Planet B.



The first part of the 2 day-workshop, involved sessions about global warming and the cause of climate change, the role that healthy soil plays in reducing global warming consequences, how participating in eco-volunteering activities could support good environmental actions, and there was

It was a chance for students to talk in English (which is not their mother tongue) about how they feel regarding climate change, what is this phenomenon for them, and how climate change is affecting their local realities.

The second part of the workshops was devoted to a short debriefing and preparing posters and drawings to raise awareness about the topics of climate change.

Students prepared 7 posters (individual and pair work) for the exhibition and the booklet.

The posters were printed in A2 format and presented in a form of an exhibition in the local school.

What is more, there was an official opening of the exhibition and a big photo cake with a chance for students to talk about their posters to their peers. The exhibition was displayed in the local high school for 3 weeks, next it was taken to a local commercial center and placed in an exhibition-designated place.
